<u>Publication of the Inspectors' Report: The Greater Norwich Local Plan (GNLP)</u>

The Greater Norwich Local Plan (GNLP) was submitted to the Secretary of State for examination on 30 July 2021. The Secretary of State appointed Mike Worden BA (Hons) Dip TP MRTPI and Thomas Hatfield BA (Hons) MA MRTPI to conduct an independent examination.

Notice is hereby given in accordance with Regulation 25 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 that on 20th February 2024 South Norfolk Council received the Inspectors' Final Report on the examination of the GNLP. The report sets out the Inspector's recommendations and the reasons for them and completes the examination process.

The Inspectors' Report concludes that subject to the main modifications set out in the report, the GNLP satisfies the requirements of Section 20(5) of the 2004 Act and meets the criteria for soundness as set out in the National Planning Policy Framework and is capable of adoption.
